

Sacred Wagon Shooting Qualification (BQ-01)

This document establishes a baseline firearms qualification standard inspired by federal Air Marshal evaluation models and Special Operations Forces accountability principles. It is a qualification framework, not a tactical instruction manual.

Core Principles

- 1 Safety is non-negotiable. Any unsafe act results in immediate disqualification.
- 2 Accountability over speed. Accurate, responsible hits matter more than rapid fire.
- 3 Judgment under stress. Shooters are evaluated on discipline and restraint.
- 4 Practical accuracy. Emphasis on repeatable, defensible performance.
- 5 Consistency. Qualification must be repeatable, not a single successful attempt.

Qualification Structure

- 1 Platforms evaluated: Handgun (Pistol) and Shoulder-fired defensive firearm (Carbine).
- 2 Evaluation categories include practical defensive shooting, precision accountability, close-quarters control, and weapon handling.
- 3 Performance levels: Unqualified, Qualified, Advanced, and Instructor-Eligible.

Baseline Evaluation Events

- 1 Safe Weapon Handling Evaluation – verifies discipline and command compliance.
- 2 Practical Accuracy Evaluation (Pistol) – measures defensive accountability.
- 3 Practical Accuracy Evaluation (Carbine) – measures stability and recoil control.
- 4 Precision Evaluation – tests shooter patience and fundamentals.
- 5 Close-Quarters Control Evaluation – emphasizes safe operation in confined spaces.
- 6 Weapon Transition Evaluation – assesses problem-solving and control.
- 7 Timed Accountability Evaluation – measures performance under time pressure.
- 8 Decision-Making / No-Shoot Evaluation – tests judgment and restraint.
- 9 Consistency Evaluation – confirms repeatable acceptable performance.

Scoring Model



- 1 80% or higher: Qualified
- 2 90% or higher: Advanced
- 3 95% or higher: Instructor-Eligible (range officer evaluated)
- 4 Zero safety violations and all judgment evaluations must be passed to qualify.

Sacred Wagon Ambassador Role

A Sacred Wagon Ambassador represents the organization's values, standards, and public-facing mission. Ambassadors are not influencers or tactical operators; they are trusted representatives of safety, responsibility, and leadership.

Ambassador Responsibilities

- 1 Uphold and model Sacred Wagon safety, discipline, and accountability standards.
- 2 Educate the public on responsible firearm ownership and community safety principles.
- 3 Assist at sanctioned training events, qualifications, and community programs.
- 4 Serve as a mentor and example for new shooters and program participants.
- 5 Represent Sacred Wagon professionally at events, ranges, and public engagements.
- 6 Provide feedback to leadership to improve training and community outreach.

Ambassador Eligibility

- 1 Meets or exceeds Sacred Wagon qualification standards.
- 2 Demonstrates consistent safe handling and judgment.
- 3 Approved by Sacred Wagon leadership or designated instructors.
- 4 Agrees to uphold Sacred Wagon ethics and conduct guidelines.

Ambassadors help ensure Sacred Wagon remains a trusted, credible, and community-focused organization. They reinforce the mission that skill and safety must always coexist.
